






Household Composition



The COVID-19 pandemic impacted the number of people in shelter. Policies intended to reduce the spread of the virus limited capacity in traditional shelters. Central Florida responded by increasing resources available for noncongregate shelter options via ESG-CV funding.


As a result, our sheltered population has returned to prepandemic levels.

Unsheltered Count


Insights

The number of people experiencing unsheltered homelessness increased by 253% from 2023 to 2024. The number of volunteers for this year's PIT increased by 400% (+355 people) which resulted in a 238% increase in completed surveys.

The primary driver of the increase in unsheltered homelessness is the continuing lack of affordable housing coupled with rising rents and high eviction rates.

Race Distribution













Regional PIT Trend







Point-in-Time Count Trend



Sheltered Count vs. Unsheltered Count Trend








Seminole County Heat Maps
