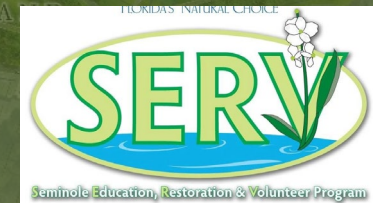

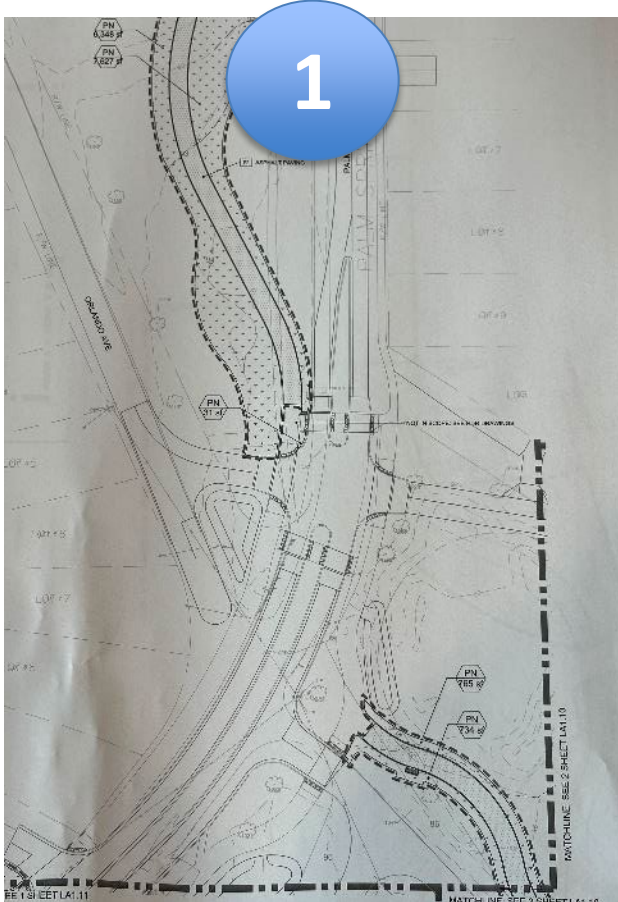
Inclusive Playground Element - Funding Added

- Fastest Growing Concern is Autism Spectrum Disorders

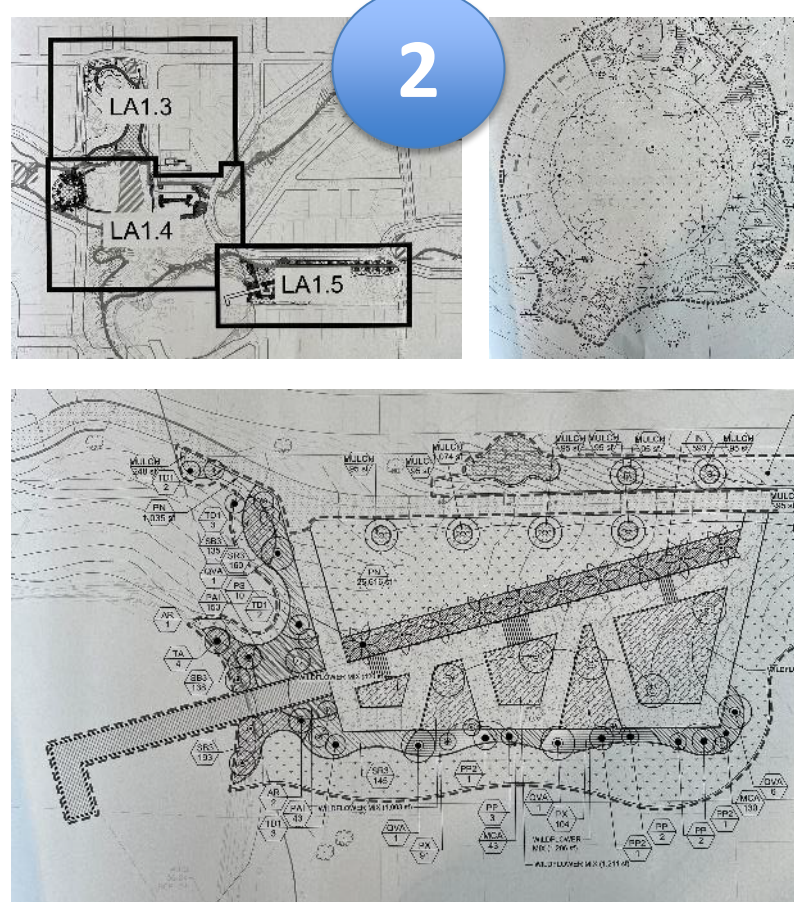

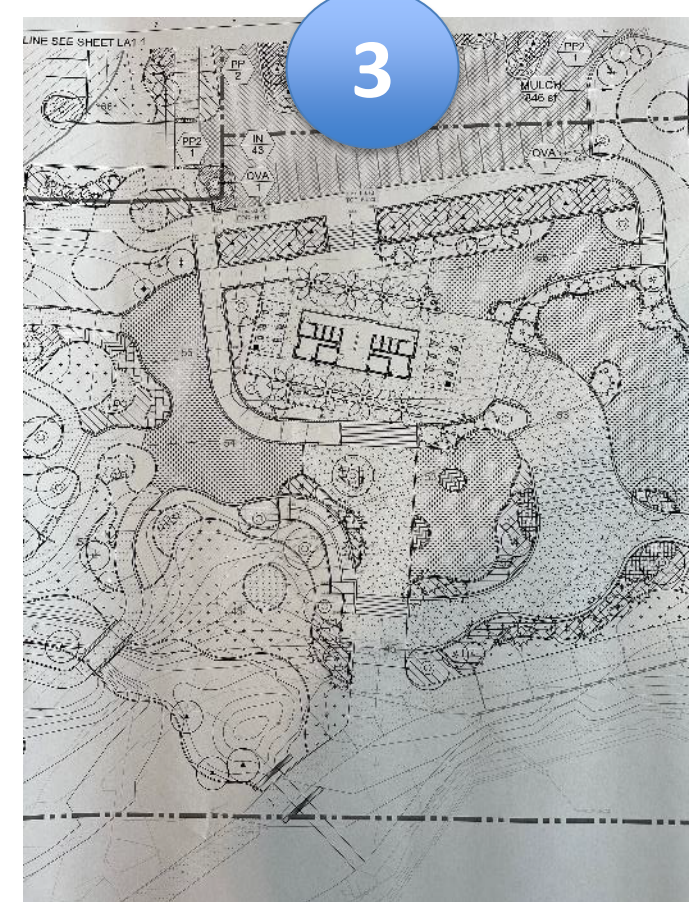
Design & Engineering Developed 2022-2024: Roadways, Trails, Park Amenities and Inclusive Playground

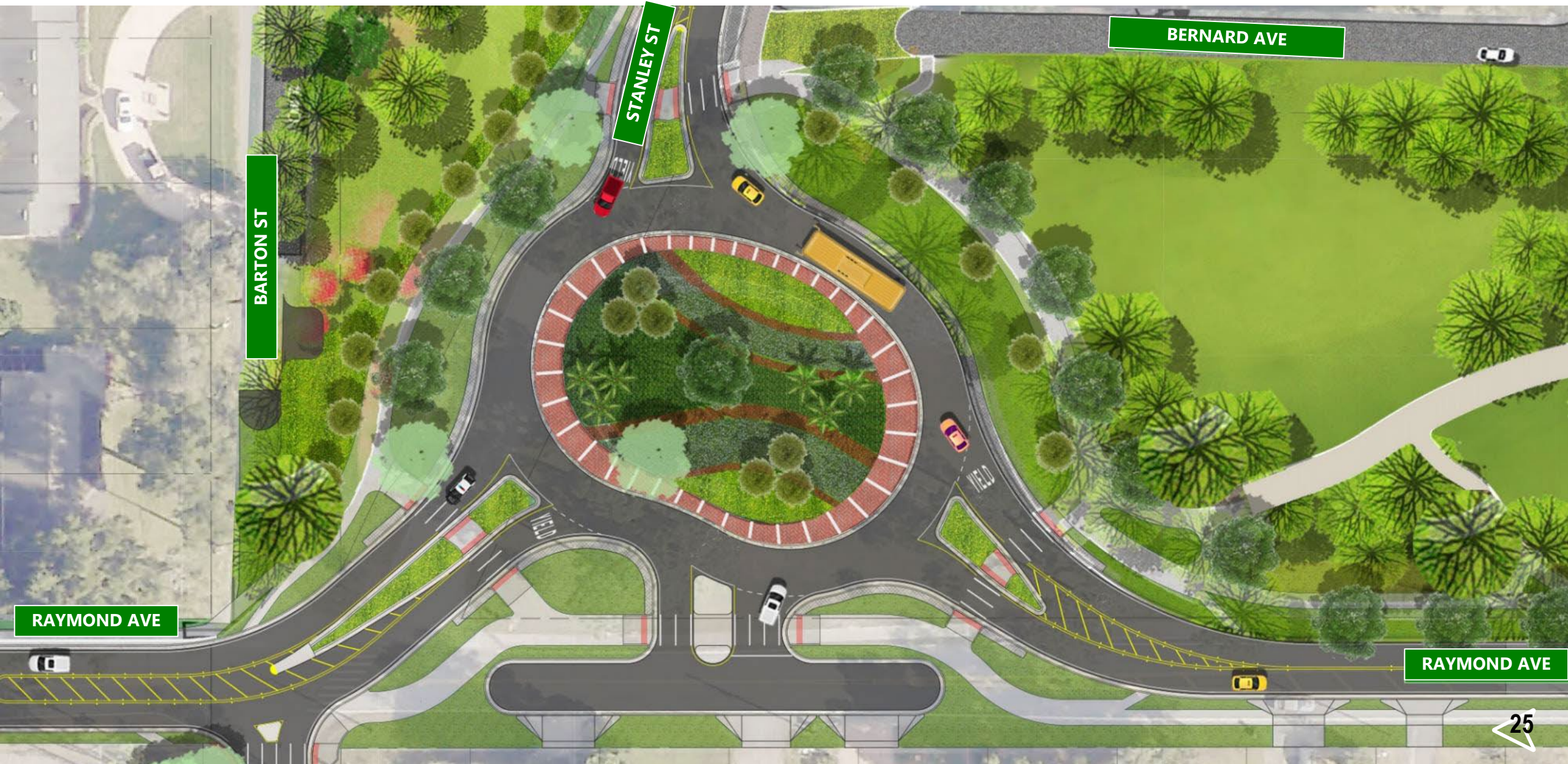

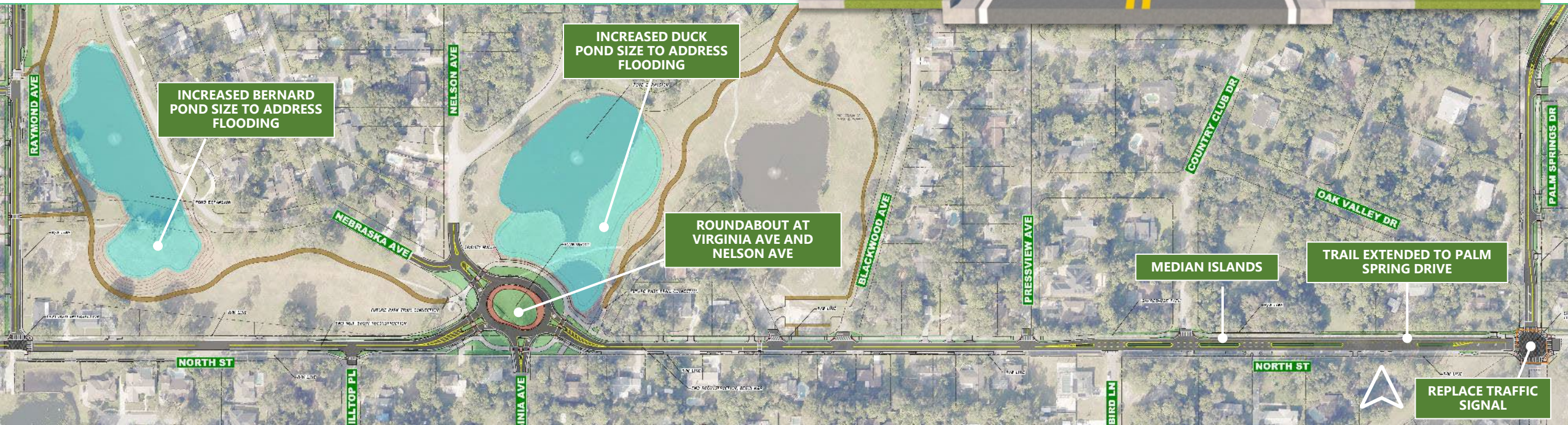

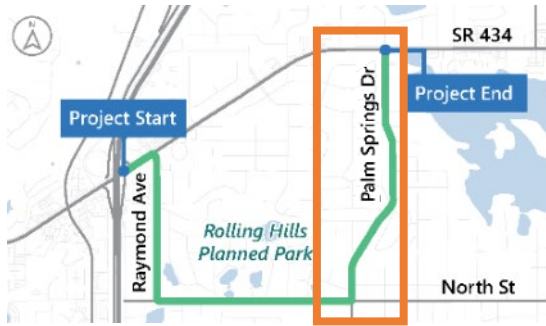

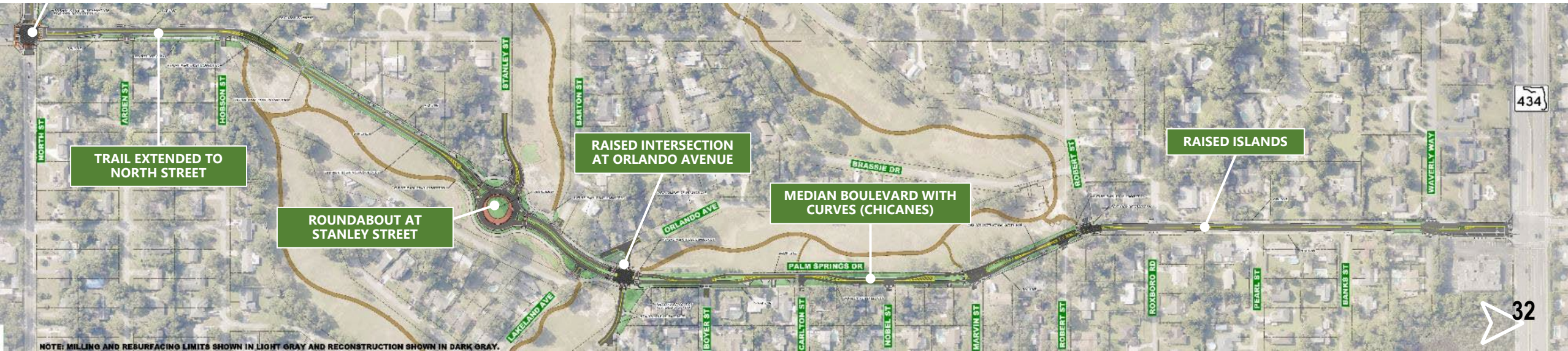
