## SEMINOLE COUNTY, FLORIDA

**ORDINANCE** AMENDING ARTICLE VII AN (PARKING 2 **REGULATIONS) OF CHAPTER 250 (TRAFFIC) OF THE SEMINOLE** COUNTY CODE: AMENDING SECTION 250.75. TRUCK PARKING IN 4 **RESIDENTIALLY ZONED DISTRICTS, TO INCREASE THE WEIGHT** THRESHOLD FOR TRUCKS PARKED IN RESIDENTIALLY ZONED 6 AREAS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION IN THE SEMINOLE COUNTY CODE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING 8 AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on January 9, 2024, Seminole County adopted Ordinance 2024-2, repealing and replacing Chapter 30 of the Seminole County Land Development Code ("LDC Rewrite"); and
WHEREAS, the LDC Rewrite Ordinance adopted changes to Chapter 30, Part 9, Section 30.9.4, Truck parking in residential zone districts, of the Seminole County Land Development
Code ("LDC") to increase the gross vehicle weight of trucks parked in residentially zoned areas from two (2) tons to 14,000 pounds and to exclude personal pickup trucks and recreational vehicles
from weight and classification limitations; and
WHEREAS, Seminole County desires to amend Article VII, Chapter 250 (Traffic),
Section 250.75 (Truck parking in residentially zoned districts) of the Seminole County Code of

20 **WHEREAS**, this Ordinance is in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare by ensuring uniformity between County rules and regulations.

- 24 **Section 1. Incorporation of Recitals.** The above recitals represent the legislative findings of the Seminole County Board of County Commissioners supporting the need for this Ordinance.

Section 2. Article VII (Parking Regulations) of Chapter 250 (Traffic) of the Seminole County Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

#### **Chapter 250 – TRAFFIC**

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### **ARTICLE VII. PARKING REGULATIONS**

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Sec. 250.75. Truck parking in-residentially residential zoned districts. No trucks 32 having a rated load limit of more than two (2) tons or having more than two (2) axles may be parked or stored in any residentially zoned area other than to load or unload merchandise. No 34 truck of any size that has operating motorized cooling units is permitted to be parked in any residentially zoned area. No trucks having a gross vehicle weight of more than 14,000 pounds 36 may be parked or stored in any residentially zoned area other than to load or unload merchandise; nor may any truck of any size, which has operating motorized cooling units, be permitted to be 38 parked in any residentially zoned area. Only the Federal Highway Administration (FHA) vehicle weight class categories of Class 1 through Class 3 trucks meeting the above weight limitation may 40 be parked in residentially zoned areas. The weight and classification limitations contained herein do not apply to personal pickup trucks or personal recreational vehicles (RVs) as defined by 42 Section 320.01(b), Florida Statutes.

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**Section 3. Codification.** It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this Ordinance will become and be made a part of the Seminole County Code, and that the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section", "article", or other appropriate word

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**Section 4. Severability.** If any provision or application of this Ordinance to any person or circumstance is held invalid, then it is the intent of the Board of County Commissioners that

Section 5. Effective date. This Ordinance will take effect upon filing a copy of this Ordinance with the Department of State by the Clerk to the Board of County Commissioners.
