

VARIANCE CRITERIA

Respond completely and fully to all six criteria listed below to demonstrate that the request meets the standards of Land Development Code of Seminole County Sec. 30.43(3) for the granting of a variance:

1. Describe the special conditions and circumstances that exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved, and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the same zoning district.

Fence Installer encroached 6" too close to sidewalk. Next to Street. No Neighbor involved.

2. Describe how special conditions and circumstances that currently exist are not the result of the actions of the applicant or petitioner.

We provided plans but installer cut it too close

3. Explain how the granting of the variance request would not confer on the applicant, or petitioner, any special privilege that is denied by Chapter 30 to other lands, buildings, or structures in the same zoning district.

Only 2-3 Post of the fence are 6" too close to sidewalk. This is a very small variance. Next to Street, no neighbor involved.

4. Describe how the literal interpretation of the provisions of the zoning regulations would deprive the applicant, or petitioner, of rights commonly enjoyed by other properties in the same zoning district and would work unnecessary and undue hardship on the applicant or petitioner.

Poles are deep in cement and difficult to move.

5. Describe how the requested variance is the minimum variance that will make possible the reasonable use of the land, building, or structure.

Only 6" variance for 2-3 fence Posts

6. Describe how the granting of the variance will be in harmony with the general intent and purpose of the zoning regulations and will not be injurious to the neighborhood, or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare.

Only 6" variance for 2-3 fence Posts Next to street. no neighbor involved.
