

PUBLIC NOTICE AND INVITATION FOR PUBLIC COMMENT
Proposed Substantial Amendment to the Seminole County FY2023 One-Year Action Plan

On April 23, 2024, the Seminole County Board of County Commissioners (BCC) will be considering the proposed substantial amendment of the FY2023 One-Year Action Plan. The One-Year Action Plan governs the allocation and expenditure of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnership Program, and the Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG).

The proposed Substantial Amendment of the FY 2023 One-Year Action Plan is to provide a second allocation of the Rapid Unsheltered Survivor Housing (RUSH) funding under the ESG program where HUD is making available an additional \$125,578 in ESG disaster funding to Seminole County.

- The Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Program budget will be amended to:
 - Increase the special allocation of ESG funding to address the needs of literally homeless individuals and families, or individuals and families at-risk of homelessness in areas affected by a major disaster.
 - ESG-RUSH funding will be allocated as follows:

This change to the FY2023 One-Year Action Plan allows new funds to be used under the ESG guidelines as it relates to homeless individuals and families, or individuals and families who are at-risk of homelessness that have been residing in an area affected by a major disaster and have needs that will not be served or fully served by the TSA Program and other existing Federal disaster relief programs.

The public comment period will begin on March 24, 2024 through April 23, 2024.
