RECOMMENDATION: Based on the on the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order issued on July 8, 2022, the Code Enforcement Board issue an Order imposing a fine in the amount **\$1,400.00** for fourteen (14) days of repeat violation, at \$100.00 per day, from July 27, 2023, through and including August 9, 2023.
