Background:

The 10-foot trail was designed and constructed by the Public Works
Department/Engineering Division with an asphaltic surface. This asphalt material for
county trails meets the current specifications outlined in the Seminole County

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Department of Public Works Engineering Manual. However, a representative from the North Cove Homeowners Association has requested the removal of the asphalt material and replaced it with a concrete surface.

The estimated cost for the removal of this 1200 linear feet of asphalt trail and replacement with 1200 linear feet of concrete surface is approximately \$116,500.00.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends the Board approve and authorize the removal of approximately 1200 linear feet of existing 10-foot asphalt trail and replace it with approximately 1200 linear feet of concrete surface.
